In the name of Allah, the Almighty, and in honor of the eternal heroes of resistance, the ¹⁸th International Resistance Film Festival is on the horizon! Organized by the Association of Cinema-Makers of the Islamic Revolution and Sacred Defense, and inspired by the teachings of the revered Martyr General Qassem Soleimani, this event is held under the wise leadership of Ayatollah Khamenei, the leader of the Islamic Revolution (may his exalted presence continue). This year, the festivals theme is "Discourse of Resistance: Operation Al Aqsa Storm, Freedom of the Holy Quds."

As the largest platform for showcasing and competing with cinematic works focused on themes of resistance, the struggle against oppression, and the quest for freedom, the Resistance Film Festival offers a unique opportunity for filmmakers, both domestic and international. It recognizes the power of art in amplifying the voices of the oppressed worldwide and aims to present a clear vision of the aspirations of resistance movements, particularly in the journey toward the liberation of the Holy Quds.

We hope this festival will transform cinema into a powerful medium for advocating persistent rights in the face of global oppression!

Objectives:

- 1. To elucidate, promote, and disseminate the discourse of resistance and the struggle against oppression on behalf of the oppressed people of the world, while confronting international Zionism.
- 2. To expand the realm of resistance cinema and inspire the creation of cinematic works that challenge tyranny and oppose oppression.
- 3. To establish a regional and global artistic movement of resistance that counters the liberal artistic movement promoting global hegemony.
- 4. To provide effective leadership in the development of both form and content within resistance cinema, as well as to innovate approaches to organizing film festivals.
- 5. To discover and nurture talented filmmakers, supporting and networking those dedicated to the principles of resistance.
- 6. To engage filmmakers who align with the discourse of resistance and attract professional filmmakers to participate.
- 7. To enhance the visibility of resistance films within the country through visual narratives, thereby fostering the spirit of resistance.
- 8. To facilitate collaboration among filmmakers in the resistance movement and to present the theme of resistance prominently on the international platform.



This section will be held internationally, allowing both domestic and foreign works to compete against one another. Works that have not been previously presented in the festival can participate.

Notes

- 1. In the main section, filmmakers must submit their works that align with one of the festival's thematic axes to the festival secretariat.
- 2. All works that advance to the jury stage must have English subtitles.
- 3. According to the festival's considerations, productions under 30 minutes are considered short films, while 30 minutes and above are classified as feature and medium-length films.



The Sacred Defense section recognizes the significant role of Sacred Defense cinema in national cinema, honoring the pioneers of this genre, particularly during the challenging early years until the establishment of the Islamic Republic. This section invites works from artists who have made valuable contributions in this area at the 18th International Resistance Film Festival.

- 1. Films related to the Sacred Defense can also participate in the main section, in addition to this section.
- 2. One of the main criteria for selecting works in this section is adaptation from written literature related to Sacred Defense.
- 3. According to the festival's considerations, productions under 30 minutes are classified as short films, while those 30 minutes and longer are considered feature and medium-length films.

- 2. Filmmakers are encouraged to submit works centered around philosophical themes, the liberation of Holy Quds, and a world without Israel to the festival secretariat.
- 3. According to the festival's guidelines, productions under 30 minutes are considered short films, while those over 30 minutes are classified as feature-length or medium-length films.

This section focuses on promoting and nurturing young filmmakers, specifically teenagers and youth, with a strong emphasis on resistance themes through short films (both narrative and animated). It serves as a principal section of the ¹⁸th International Resistance Film Festival, aiming to discover new talent for the future of Islamic resistance cinema.

Notes:

- 1. Welcomes works from teenagers and youth focusing on resistance themes.
- 2. Submitted works will be evaluated with a content-centered approach.
- 3. Special support will be offered to winners for the production of future works.
- 4. Awards will be attributed to the director of the submitted works.
- 5. Participants must be under 30 years old.
- 6. Selected individuals will be recognized as official artistic elites of the National Foundation for Elites, receiving all associated benefits.

VIII. Special Section for Artificial Intelligence Productions: (Award of Seyyed Hussein Alam Al-Huda)

1. Screenplay, Story Outline, or Screenplay Outline

Fictional works focusing on various aspects of the discourse surrounding the Islamic Revolution and resistance, aimed at producing both short and feature-length cinematic screenplays.

2. Analytical Articles on Resistance Cinema:

Articles that analyze the historical, social, and political dimensions of the cinema of the Islamic Revolution and the discourse on resistance.

3. Visual Art and Graphics:


Creation of posters, storyboards, and illustrations related to significant works in the history of war cinema and Iran's Sacred Defense, as well as notable international contributions.

4. Short Animations:

Development of animations based on the festival's eighteen themes.

5. Film Music and Composition:

Production of soundtracks and melodies connected to important works in the history of war cinema and Iran's Sacred Defense, as well as international pieces.



6. Short Documentaries:

Documentaries focusing on the historical, social, and political analysis of cinema related to the Islamic Revolution and the discourse on resistance.

Notes:

- 1. The best media productions featuring artificial intelligence will be selected by the judges and announced in three different categories.
- 2. Productions will be evaluated for quality after review; only those meeting the required standards will proceed to the judging phase.
- 3. Submitted works will be assessed based on content, regardless of their submission format.

- 1. Certificate of Honor and cash prize for the best animation
- 2. Certificate of Honor and cash prize for the best film
- 3. Certificate of Honor and cash prize for the best documentary









General Rules and Conditions for Submitting Works

- The content of the participating works must align with one of the thematic axes of the festival.
- The works submitted to the festival must not include offensive themes towards religions, sects, ethnic groups, etc.
- There is no limit to the number of works that can be submitted.

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- The applicant for participation in the festival must be the producer or owner of the work and is responsible for the legal aspects of the work.
- Submitting a work to the festival's secretariat implies acceptance of all festival regulations.
- Registration for the work in all categories must be completed exclusively through the festival's website.
- If a selected work has multiple authors, directors, producers, etc., only one prize will be awarded in each category.
- The right to screen the works submitted to the secretariat is reserved for the festival organizing committee.
- The organizing committee is permitted to use up to one minute of the submitted works for promotional and informational purposes.
- The festival secretariat is not responsible for any damages resulting from the improper submission of works by participants.
- Submitted copies of films will not be returned after they are sent to the festival secretariat.
- Once works are selected for the competition section, they cannot be withdrawn from the festival.
- If the information provided for a work does not match the details in the submitted forms, the secretariat may remove the work at any stage of the festival.
- Decisions regarding unforeseen matters are at the discretion of the festival secretariat.
- Iranian films wishing to participate in the main section must include English subtitles.
- Iranian films produced in a language or dialect other than Persian must include Persian subtitles.

Special Opportunities

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In the 18th International Resistance Film Festival, a series of special opportunities are provided for participants, which are detailed below:

1. Support for Production of Works:

Financial assistance will be provided for the production of the next work from festival funds to three selected writers in the Narrative Generation section. There will also be financial and moral support for selected works in various categories, especially those related to themes of resistance and anti-imperialism.

2. Membership in the National Elite Foundation:

Winners under the age of 30 in the Narrative Generation section will be introduced as artistic elites and will benefit from all the privileges of the National Elite Foundation.

3. Morteza Award:

Unveiling and presenting the Morteza Award to prominent figures in the documentary cinema of resistance.

4. International Screening of Works:

Screening of selected works in the countries of the resistance axis and other coordinated countries, along with the introduction of filmmakers as ambassadors of resistance cinema.

5. Educational Workshops and Experience Sharing:

Holding specialized workshops in areas such as ideation, storytelling, documentary filmmaking, and the use of modern technologies like artificial intelligence and virtual reality, featuring distinguished filmmakers from both domestic and international backgrounds.

6. Resistance Film Market:

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Participation of 20 distributors and international platforms in the Resistance Film Market to present and distribute the participants' works, providing opportunities for interaction with international producers and investors for the production and distribution of cinematic products.

7. Innovative Campaigns:

- Campaign of American Wounds in Gaza: For films produced with mobile devices, emphasizing the display of global imperialism's crimes in the resistance axis.
- Campaign for Idea Submission: Submission of creative ideas for producing works in the form of short films, documentaries, feature films, and animations.
 - 8. Establishing an international association of independent filmmakers.
- 9. Opportunity to participate in international festival programs and to network with global resistance filmmakers.
- 10. Publication and introduction of selected works on domestic and international platforms in five major world languages.
 - 11. Knowledge production and discourse formation: Publication of selected festival research in book form.
- 12. Hosting academic meetings and theoretical discussions on the subject of resistance cinema and the expansion of the discourse on anti-imperialism.


All applicants have the opportunity to submit their works in various sections and formats in the 18th International Resistance Film Festival until January 19, 2025.
